Quality of Education

Ensuring a strong curriculum and good teaching to support children's progress.

We want every pupil to remember what they learn, connect ideas, and make excellent progress.

This year we will:

- Use retrieval and review so pupils remember and link learning across all subjects.
- Check for understanding in every lesson and adapt teaching so no pupil is left behind.
- Monitor curriculum changes to make sure they are making a real difference to learning.

Behaviour & Attitudes

Ensuring good school attendance.

We want our school to be a calm, happy, and safe place where pupils are ready to learn.

This year we will:

- Build a shared language for emotions so children can talk about how they feel and stay ready to learn.
- Improve attendance so we reach at least 97%, with fewer children missing too much school.

This year we will:
