


Welcome to Year 1!

Transitioning from Reception

- Routines will mirror those from Reception Summer 2, in Autumn 1, progressing into more focused learning as the year progresses, as and when the children are ready.
- Provision based classroom: 'Me time' aka 'Busy Time'.
- The E in Me is for engineering, engaging, enjoying, exploring, experimenting, exciting, energising.
- This is time for children to initiate their own learning in play-based provision. Our expectation is that children choose how to spend their time following their interests in our classroom developing their learning through play and creativity.
- Areas will be enhanced with resources linking to current learning throughout the year for children to extend and consolidate learning.
- Children will continue to use the outdoor learning space from Beech Class.

<u>Maths</u>

- We will be working our way through the Year 1 National Curriculum using White rose maths beginning with Place Value to 10.
- We work with lots of practical maths resources and believe in hands on, visual practice.
- Early Bird Maths / English every morning reviewing previously taught objective and allow practice.
- Regular quizzes and cold calling for practice.
- Tailored support and interventions will be in place for those children who need it.





Key word spellings

Reading

- Children will read with an adult at least once a week as well as many opportunities in phonics.
- We will change their reading book each week please try and read with your child at home as much as you can. Their book, signs etc but never turn them off the pleasure, if it is a chore stop.
- The children will also be able to take home a library book which will be swapped each week, once the previous book has been returned.
- Please make sure both books are in their bags every day as we may swap their book any day.
- We read in guided reading groups which are children at a similar level to them as the year progresses.
- Reading for pleasure book Teacher reads to class during snack time, before lunch and at the end of the day.
- At 3pm every day, every class has a reading session before home.
- We will also be sending a reading scrap book home with for your child to review a book.



Reading Scrapbook

- Every Wednesday we will send home our reading scrapbook to one child in the class. This is an opportunity for your child to have a great time deciding on a book and creating a page in our book. We will send the scrapbook home with all you need and we can print an image of your chosen book, just leave us enough space.
- Make it your own, be creative, we would love them to be unique. What we will be left with is 30 book recommendations which we will turn into a list for you at the end of the year.







Assessments

- At Coppice, we like to do low stakes quizzing to assess children's knowledge. Children enjoy quizzes which takes away the pressure. We begin to practice this technique in Year 1 and is nothing for them to worry about.
- We do 2 writing assessments over the year which is marked using a scheme called no more marking, it helps use to understand how their writing compares nationally and look at their progress.
- The children will also undertake more formal assessments in the Summer term in Maths, reading and spelling so that we have a solid picture of their understanding going into the final year of KS1.
- We work hard in Year 1 to prepare children for the phonics screening test which takes place in June – this is the only statuary government test we do in Year 1.






Phonics

- The screening test is a test where each child reads 40 words to their teacher. 20 are alien words, 20 are real words. They have to read 32 (currently) to pass the test. If they do not pass they can re take it in year 2 so it is something we practice for but don't want them to feel the pressure of.
- At Coppice, we currently follow a phonics scheme called Active learn and bug club.
- We do phonics daily for at least 20/30 minutes.
- Practicing sounding out words and blending back together at home will help with confidence. We will tell you more about how you can support us, to support them.

Homework

- We expect that children are reading at home regularly. This could be reading to themselves, to an adult or sibling or an adult reading to them. Take part in the reading scrapbook challenge
- If you want to look at our handwriting scheme you can log on at home via letterjoin.co.uk
- We will send out more prep work that you can do at home for the screening test after Easter.
- Practice of times tables (2, 5, 10) and our key word spellings is also expected once they are taught. We will message you before each holiday with any practice we would like.





Behaviour and Expectations

We promote and work every day using our school rules: Aim High, Work Hard and Be Kind.

Your child's positive behaviour, work and attitudes will always be celebrated and praised.

We have our celebration assembly on a Friday, our classroom recognition tree and postcards that go home.

Any poor behaviour in class will be addressed and the school's behaviour policy will be followed. We will talk to you privately if we need to follow up anything with you regarding behaviour.
