



Year 1 Summer overview

Subject	Summer 1
Class read	<p>The Magic Finger by Roald Dahl.</p>  <p>Through group reading and being exposed to high- quality books. The children will be exposed to high- quality vocabulary. The children will have the opportunity to infer and discuss gaining greater comprehension and through this group read will develop skills for their English education.</p>
English Writing and reading.	<p>Book focus 'Astro Girl' by Ken Wilson-Max.</p>  <p>This term the children will be focusing on their narrative writing. We will begin to develop composition of sentences, spelling common exception words and using suffix '-ing' '-ed' '-er' and '-est'.</p>
Maths	<p>Multiplication and Division.</p> <p>This term the children will use concrete manipulatives to conceptualise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's and how to share them into equal groups.</p>
Science	<p>Animals including humans.</p>

	<p>We will be learning about different animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, and mammals, as well as their diets (carnivores, herbivores, and omnivores). They will also explore the structure of these animals and study the basic parts of the human body, linking each part to its associated sense.</p>
History	<p>Famous Explorers. We will learn about famous explorers May Jemison, the first African American woman in space, and Sir David Attenborough, a renowned naturalist. They will compare their achievements and explore how their work in space and the natural world contributed to history.</p>
Art	<p>Collage and Printing</p> <p>We will learn to layer different materials, such as paper, fabric, and textures, to create interesting visual effects. We'll also be experimenting with various printing methods to add depth and texture to their artwork. This will allow the children to express their creativity while developing skills in using materials in new and exciting ways.</p>
PE	<p>Co- ordination and agility activities and preparing for sports day.</p> <p>In this unit, the children will develop and apply their sending and receiving and reaction and response through focused skill development sessions, thematic stories and games.</p>
PSHE	<p>Safety and the changing body.</p> <p>In our lessons, the children will learn about the importance of being unique</p>

	and working cooperatively with others. They will develop skills in listening, showing respect, sharing, and recognising how their behaviour affects those around them, both online and offline. Additionally, they will understand the concepts of right and wrong, kindness, fairness, and how to handle change.
